Reporting on the Reports



Three reports were published by the team in November - the Public Summer Consultation Report, the Bletchley and Fenny Stratford Parking Demand and Capacity Study, and the Banking Hub Report.

All three reports were commissioned by Milton Keynes City Council. The findings help inform areas of the Town Deal projects for Bletchley and Fenny Stratford including Queensway, Aylesbury Street and Saxon Street.

This month it's the turn of the Parking study, and the Banking Hub Report.

This Way to Parking Study

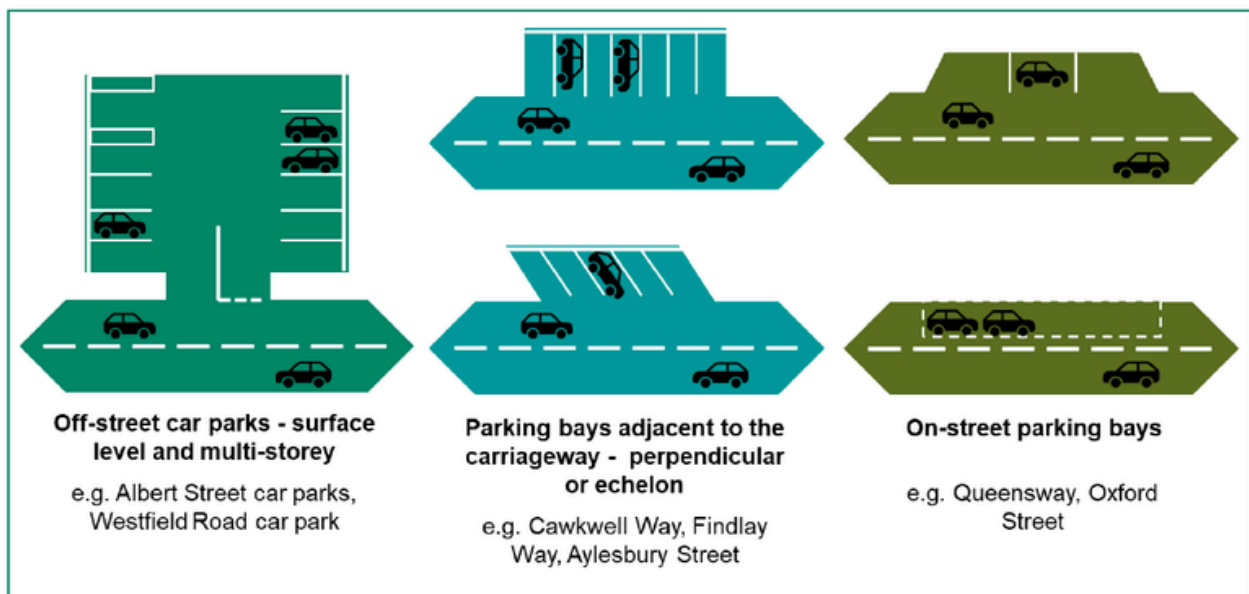


Figure 4-2: Car Park Layout Typologies

One of the key issues raised in the Parking Demand and Capacity Study was the parking on pavements and ignoring of double yellow lines along Queensway. It noted that people value convenience and therefore want to park as close as possible to the shops and other services particularly along Queensway, even though there are off-street parking facilities a short distance away. This is because visits to the town centres tends to be short, in most cases less than a couple of hours and even shorter.

The Town Deal improvement plans for Queensway and Aylesbury Street, will prevent the illegal parking by installing a physical solution that is effective, robust and complements the wider aims of the Town Deal objectives.

As part of the plans there will be better signage to carparks and parking restrictions signs as well as robust parking enforcement. We are working with our parking enforcement team to raise awareness of the issues in the area so that it can put an improved service in place for Queensway now.

Banking Hub

With the planned closure of Lloyds Bank on Queensway people are concerned about the availability of banking facilities in the area.

LINK, the organisation that carries out assessments when there is a change to the level of cash access in a community, was tasked with identifying what Bletchley requires in terms of banking services. Based on its assessment, LINK concluded that unfortunately Bletchley does not qualify for a banking hub.

The 2025 sessions kick off at the Frank Moran Centre on Monday 20 January, and Sycamore House on 27 January, 2 - 4pm.

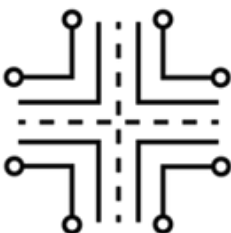
Looking for 2050 Visions
