4.	Brunel Consultation Feedback and Conclusions	
	The consultation has been extended until 31 December. An additional drop-in session is due to take place at the Duncombe community centre on 18 December between 18:00 – 20:00. This information can be shared widely from 06 December.	
	The consultation results are expected in January and the programme team will look to arrange an additional Advisory group meeting to share the consultation results.	
	CBG highlighted that communicating the outcomes of Delegated Decisions is taking too long and the process needs to be quicker.	
	CBG requested that dates of future consultations are proactively shared with group members via email in advance as part of the ongoing engagement work. DC agreed this would be a fair expectation for the group.	
5.	Programme Update	
	DC provided an update. The Innovation Hub project will cease to exist due to viability issues highlighted during the soft market testing process. At a recent meeting with the Town Deal Board it was unanimously agreed that funds would be reallocated within the programme. At this stage a new project would be deemed too much of a risk by DLUHC.	
	 The additional funds will be reallocated to the following projects Revolving Development Fund PRI Redways 	
	Note that the amounts are subject to approval from DLUHC.	
	YL and CBG queried why RDF got the large uplift when it was already heavily funded when PRI would probably benefit more. DC confirmed that an assessment was undertaken and a decision was made off by the Town Deal Board. This assessment considered the projects ability to help address the outputs and outcomes of the Innovation Hub project, overall deliverability by March 2026, any project risk and benefits that the funds would deliver.	
6.	Advisory Group Member Networks	
	VB and CBG will continue to follow up Youth groups and will share details with DC.
